

Required Equipment for Itasca Action Pistol:

1. Safety Glasses.
2. Hearing protection; either ear muffs or plugs.
3. A safe attitude and willingness to follow the safety officer's instructions.
4. A fully functioning center-fire pistol suitable for concealed carry. .22 rimfire is not allowed. As a practical note, anything less than 9mm may not be sufficient to knock over some of the steel targets.
5. You can use normal sights or optics like a Red Dot sight. At the end of the season we do night shooting, where you will have a chance to use flashlights and or lasers.
6. Hip holster. Cross draw holsters and pocket carry are not allowed due to safety issues. Kydex or leather, nylon doesn't provide the necessary retention. Serpa Level 2 tactical holsters are not allowed due to safety issues. Call with questions.
7. Cover garment: a vest, shirt or coat long enough to fully cover the muzzle of your holstered pistol. It does get hot in the summer, so a lightweight vest or long shirt helps.
8. Enough magazines to hold 31 rounds. Pouches or clips to hold these on your belt are strongly recommended.
9. 100 rounds of ammunition. You won't shoot it all, but the number of shots fired varies between nights.
10. Five dollars per night. You should bring a couple extra dollar bills if you like to "accidentally" shoot non-threats.
11. Hydration, maybe a cap. An evening can be a number of hours, and on a hot summer day, you need to stay cool. Bug spray when it's that time of year.

Arrive a little early; the nightly Safety Brief begins around 5:15 PM. Set up begins at 3:30 if you want to help (and get a sneak peak at the evening's scenarios.)

This is a weekly event that does not require a weekly commitment, come when you can!
